This is an eighth note (in the US and Canada)
or a quaver (other English-speaking countries).



And if two or more eighth notes follow, they can be wrote
like this! (2 eighth notes = 1 quarter note.)



And this is a whole note! (one whole note = 4 quarter notes.)



This is aquarter rest. (No tone to hear ! You should softly touch
the string with your right or left finger, and stop the note!)

Exercise Play them on 5th Position (only use the 1st, 2nd and 3rd String)!!!
