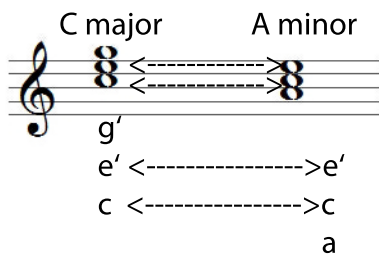

Parallel Chords

In the last lessons, you learned about Major and Minor Chords.

Each Major or Minor Chord have Parallel Chord. For example C major <-> A minor.

If you look closely, you can find they a very similar.



They have two same notes! (2 of 3 notes). This relationship is called „Parallel Chords“

Mostly used Chords on the Guitar are

C <-----> Am	G <-----> Em
D <-----> Bm	A <-----> F#m
E <-----> C#m	B <-----> G#m
F <-----> Dm	Bb <-----> Gm

You can use those Parallel Chords as replacement to make music more interesting. But you should use original Chords of Key at least by the Begin and the End!

Old McDonald (Key=C major, Tonic=C, Subdominant=F, Dominant=G)
